ASSISTED LIVING

<u>Assisted living communities</u> provide residents an opportunity to live independently while receiving assistance with activities of daily living such as transportation, meal preparation, and getting dressed.

- Residents mostly take care of themselves and live semiautonomously.
- Staff is available 24/7 to help with activities of daily living.
- Community-focused with choices of activities on or off campus.
- Some services provided on site, but residents may come and go as they please.
- Mostly private apartments or suites, but some couples live together.

NURSING HOMES

<u>Nursing homes</u>, also called long term care facilities, offer 24-hour monitoring and assistance with medical needs due to significant physical and mental health conditions.

- Patients are unable to take care of themselves and require full-time monitoring.
- Skilled nursing care is available around the clock.
- Rehabilitation-focused with an emphasis on specialized medical care.
- Almost all services provided on site: meals, salons, worship, dental, etc.
- Typically rooms are shared; however, there may be options for private rooms.
